

Notice of Rate Increase
Water Customers of the Bayfield Water and Sewer Utility

This is to give you notice that the Bayfield Water and Sewer Utility will file an application on October 15, 2020 with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC), for authority to increase water rates. Rates for general service will increase 3.0 percent. The increase is necessary to reduce the existing deficiency in present rates. The request is being made under the Wis. Stat. 196.193. Rate increased granted under this statute do not require a public hearing. The effect of the increase for some selected customers is shown below. Public Fire Protection and Wholesale rates (if applicable) will also increase 3.0 percent

Sewer Customers of the Bayfield Water and Sewer Utility

The City of Bayfield Public Works Commission agreed, unanimously on 8/19/2020, to increase sewer rates 8% for base rate and 3% for all other sewer charges starting December 1, 2020. The increase will be seen on your February 2021 bill. Rates are as follows:
