- Approve Minutes from the Previous Meeting on February 11, 2026: **Liam motioned to approve minutes Nancy second all ayes.**
- Public Input on Agenda Items – Gordon Ringberg had furnace leak starting in summer 2024 and was discovered and stopped January 2026. Water leaked between 2 slabs of cement in basement.

**Agenda Items:**

1. One way and Angle parking conversions:
  - a South Broad Street: **Discussion. two-way angle on west side. Will talk to businesses on Broad Street to get feedback. Will have 15 min. parking for City Hall and Post Office. Final Decision in April's meeting**
  - b South Second Street: **Angle one way to Manypenny Ave, curb on other side. Will talk to business owners on Second Street for feedback. Final decision in April's meeting.**
2. Public Works Relocation: **Standing item. Need figures and where. If by Sand Pit will have access to sewer, but will need to dig a well.**
3. Project Updates
  - a Water Meter Project for 2026: **Waiting for school board meeting on Monday March 16<sup>th</sup> for final decision to see if city gets approval for putting antenna on top of school. Trying to get project done by June. Working with company to help install new meters.**
  - b Manypenny Avenue: **Paid final bill. LRIP refund should be on way.**
  - c Winter Operations: **Took light decoration.**
4. Utility Operator Report: Gordon Ringberg had a leak from furnace since summer 2024. Wants a sewer credit since water did not go down sewer. Utility operator looked up history and he had about 130,000 gallons of water leak and not into sewer. **Tom motioned to credit Gordon \$1500 sewer credit, Diane seconded. All Ayes**
