Public Works Meeting
September 11, 2024

Present: Tom Bogaard, Diane Fizell, Liam DelMain via zoom.

Others: Public Works Director Joel Weber, Utility Operator Jacob Dickey, Mayor Ted Dougherty, Librarian Teresa Weber

Meeting called to order at 9:15am.

Motion to approve agenda by Tom, 2nd by Liam, Carried.

Motion to approve minutes from August 14th meeting by Diane, 2nd by Liam. Carried.

There was no public input.

Agenda Items

1. Motion by Tom, 2nd by Liam to designate (1) 15 minute parking slot next to the present ADA parking slot in the rear library parking lot, and (2) Library Only parking slots in front of the library on Broad St. listing that they are only during library hours Monday thru Saturday, 10am to 8pm. Carried

Motion by Diane, 2nd by Tom to "paint" a crosswalk 5' east of the Broad St. and Washington Ave. parking lot intersection. Carried

2. Storm damage update: FEMA application has been accepted. Joel has contacted Northwoods Paving to repair the water damaged roadway on Washington Ave. before Apple Festival. Cold mix repairs will be made on Manypenny Ave. It is hoped that the bids will be "let" next month. 95% of the design work is done. 5th St. culvert: pipe is here, Rocky Tribovich will install by next month.
3. Dynamic Speed sign request: Per State statutes it cannot be done. State criteria is
 - a. School speed limit zones/b. Reductions in speed zones within a community/c. Work zone speed limit areasJoel will explore/research other possible options for our next meeting.

4. 15 minute parking signs in front of the post office will be tabled until spring. Discussion on changing west side of that block to diagonal parking.

5. Brightspeed planned fiber build 2025. Per Bayfield ordinance, there will be no work between 11/15/2024 and 5/1/2025.

6. Permit/application fees. Motion by Tom, 2nd by Diane to raise fees under 349.6 to \$75.00. Carried.

Motion by Tom, 2nd by Diane to recommend to the council to change the permit fee for 349.5C, 349.9C, 349.10 and 349.18 to \$75.00. It will be their decision when to make it effective.

Yes Tom, Diane. No Liam. Carried.

7. Utility Operator's report: He has passed (2) water training courses, he is now a Utility Operator in Training. Waste Water training classes will be in October and November. Hydrant flushing will be the 3rd week in October. There is an upcoming sanitary survey with the DNR.

8. Bike racks: There are two in the city storage area now. Liam will check out possible sites to recommend for spring installation.
